VOICELESS ANIMAL CRUELTY INDEX 2017

Overall Rank 40

Argentina was a very poor performer under the Voiceless Animal Cruelty Index (VACI) 2017, largely due to the extremely high proportion of land-based animal protein in the Argentinian diet.

Producing Cruelty

Rank 26

Argentina slaughters on average around 1.4 land based animals per person / per year, which is more than double the global average of 9.7. Argentinian cows are traditionally grassfed, but there is a recent trend towards intensification. A 2015 USDA Report

[http://gain.fas.usda.gov/Recent%20GAIN%20Publications/Livestock%20and%20Products%20An nual_Buenos%20Aires_Argentina_9 11-2015.pdf] stated that 70-80% of cows are now "finished off" in intensive feed lots. Worldwatch [http://www.worldwatch.org/node/534] cites Argentina as a country where factory farming of pigs and poultry is expanding.

Consuming Cruelty

Rank 48

Argentina is one of the biggest animal eating countries on the planet, with around 64.5% of the average Argentinian diet being made up of land based animal protein. This is almost double the global average of 35.2%. According to a 2016 Appetite journal article

Sanctioning Cruelty

Rank 47

Argentina was given a "D" under the Animal Protection Index (API) 2014, and was a moderate performer under the Sanctioning Cruelty category. This is largely due to the quality of its farmed animal welfare legislation, its enforcement of those laws, and its incorporation of international animal welfare standards into its domestic laws.
