# **AUSTRALIA**

### **VOICELESS ANIMAL CRUELTY INDEX 2017**

### **Overall Rank 44**

Australia was a *very poor* performer under the Voiceless Animal Cruelty Index (VACI) 2017, due largely to the high level of animal protein in the Australian diet.

### **Producing Cruelty**

#### Rank 46

Australians are highly dependent on animals, having around 8.8 animals per person (more than double the global average of 4) and slaughtering around 27.2 animals per person / year (almost triple the global average of 9.7). The vast majority of Australian animals are confined in factory farms, particularly in pigs and poultry production. A significant proportion of cows (including dairy cows) are also raised or "finished" in intensive systems.

### **Consuming Cruelty**

#### Rank 50

Australians consume the second highest number of land-based animals (after the United States) and the second highest proportion of land-based animal protein in the diet (after the Netherlands). This is despite the fact that a Roy Morgan poll

[http://www.roymorgan.com/findings/vegetarianisms-slow-but-steady-rise-in-australia-201608151105] found that the number of people in Australia who identify as totally or mostly vegetarian rose from 9.7% to 11.2% between 2011 and 2016.

# **Sanctioning Cruelty**

## Rank 13

Australia was given a "C" under the Animal Protection Index (API) 2014, and ranked relatively well under the Sanctioning Cruelty category. This is largely due to the presence of comprehensive antianimal cruelty legislation at a state and territory level, although the law continues to permit a range of cruel practices, particularly to farm animals and wild animals.
